- Don't ignore it
- Report it to security staff or, the police, or call 222 from internal phone or 01293 501222 from your mobile

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF I FIND AN UNATTENDED ITEM?

- Don't ignore it
- Don't touch it
- Ask people nearby if they own the item
- Keep people away from the area
- Report it to security staff, the police, or call 222 from internal phone or 01293 501222 from your mobile

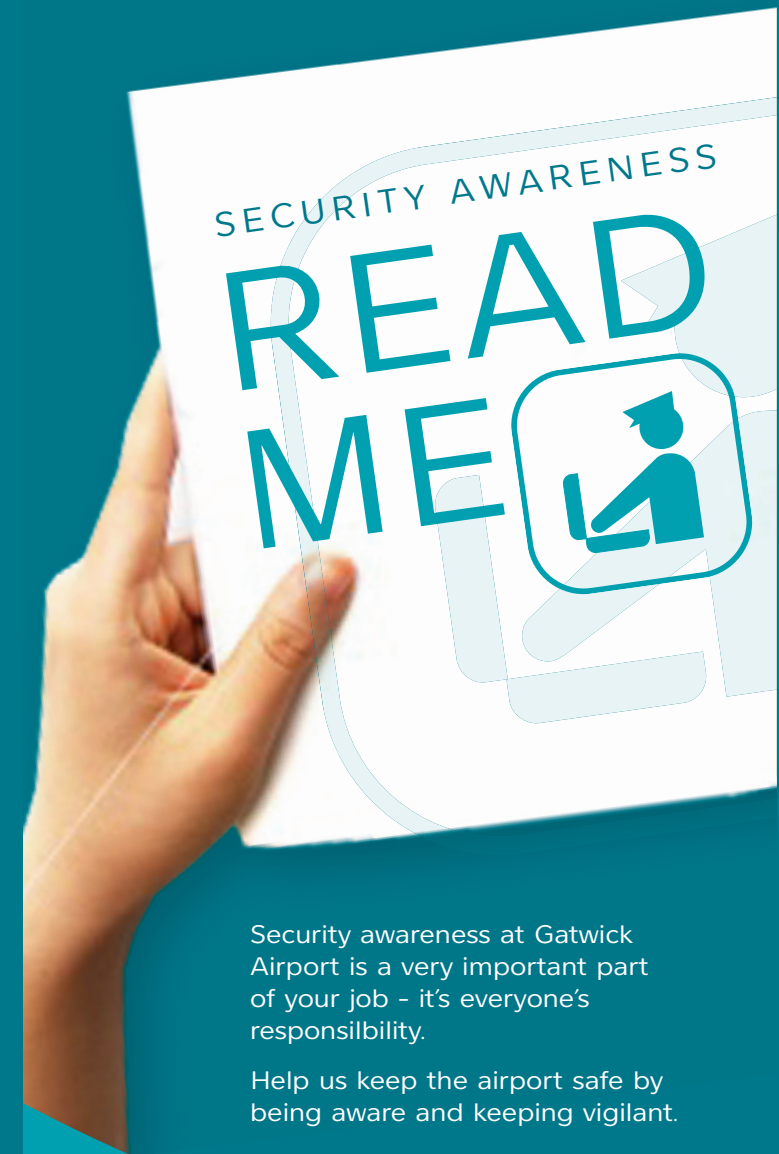
WHAT IF I RECEIVE OR FIND A WARNING OF A BOMB OR OTHER THREAT?

Try to get as much information as you can about the threat - remember the five key questions:

- 1 WHERE will it be?
- 2 WHEN will it be?
- 3 WHAT will it be?
- 4 WHO are you?
- 5 WHY are you doing this?


Wear your ID pass prominently, at chest height at all times. Remember if you lose your pass you must report it straight away:

Security awareness at Gatwick Airport is a very important part of your job - it's everyone's responsibility.

Read on to find out all you need to know to make sure you are aware of any threats to security and what you can do to help...

WHAT ARE THE THREATS?

Airports, like other parts of the transport network could be targeted by terrorists. Terrorists may attempt to hijack aircraft or to get bombs on board an aircraft or place bombs in the terminal. The terrorist threat to aviation has been at a high level for some time and looks unlikely to change in the near future.

WHY MIGHT THE AIRPORT OR AIRCRAFT BE A TARGET?

Terrorists often want to gain publicity for their cause or to force governments to change policies and, as more recent attacks have shown, to kill or injure people and disrupt normal life.

Airports may be targeted by terrorists as they are high profile, busy places where an attack could have devastating effects.

It is up to all of us to be vigilant and make it more difficult for terrorists to operate.

HOW IS THE AIRPORT PROTECTED AND WHAT CAN YOU DO TO HELP?

You will know that all staff, passengers and baggage are checked to prevent items such as guns, knives and explosives being taken on board an aircraft.

Access to the Security Restricted Area is controlled by a pass system and security check points.

You can play your part by cooperating with security checks and by always wearing your pass at chest height. Report any loss or misuse to the pass office immediately.

PASS INFORMATION

Make sure you know all the information about passes and don't be afraid to ask where someone's pass is and what they are doing.

WHITE

For people who work landside or require escorted access to a Security Restricted Area

GREEN

for people who work internally airside

BLUE

For people who need to work external airside with internal access

RED

For people who need to work in all areas of the airport

YELLOW

For people who work in non security restricted areas

WHAT ELSE CAN YOU DO?

- Be alert for people leaving items behind or items that are unattended
- Watch out for unauthorised people trying to get on board an aircraft
- Keep all equipment and stock secure and don't let unauthorised people have access to it
- Report anything suspicious to security staff or the police
